
So what is it about Christmas nostalgia that grabs our hearts? Why do I like the Hallmark specials, and all the old Christmas movies, and the commercials with the Budweiser Clydesdales, and the Christmas carolers, and the children under the tree on Christmas morning in their own home with mom and dad? Something which was very, very special to us in the past has lost its wonder. We could blame it on growing up, but that doesn't work because we're still suckers for all the nostalgic stuff that made Christmas the highlight of the year by far.

The answer is very simple. We've lost because of what we've gained. In all our efforts to make Christmas bigger and better we have lost the qualities which used to make it best. What used to be near magical in wonder has been asphyxiated under the weight of making it longer, more expensive, more demanding, more commercial, more tangled in extended families, poisoned in alcoholic parties with people we don't even like, and then endured with hangovers, debt, and hurt feelings. Happy birthday, Jesus!

It's certainly time to fix Christmas. But the fact is, it's time to fix life. We have filled our lives with so much stuff (to improve them?) that we have become too busy to live. Nothing takes first place in our lives anymore because we have overstuffed our lives to the point of fibrillation...everything is in motion, but nothing is going anywhere. This way of life is very dangerous for our marriages and families because it makes everybody feel unimportant and unappreciated. And it is absolutely deadly for our faith in God because we have no room in all the clutter of our lives to put anything or anyone in a position of priority. We are living very much like the ancient people who created signature idols to meet their specific needs. But it can be argued that our modern, sophisticated version of this paganism is even deadlier for our souls.

We can recover the sparkle of Christmas by peeling away the layers of bad habits and inappropriate demands. This Christmas, let's make sure we set aside time for those who are the very closest to us and invite Jesus back into his own birthday party with us.




